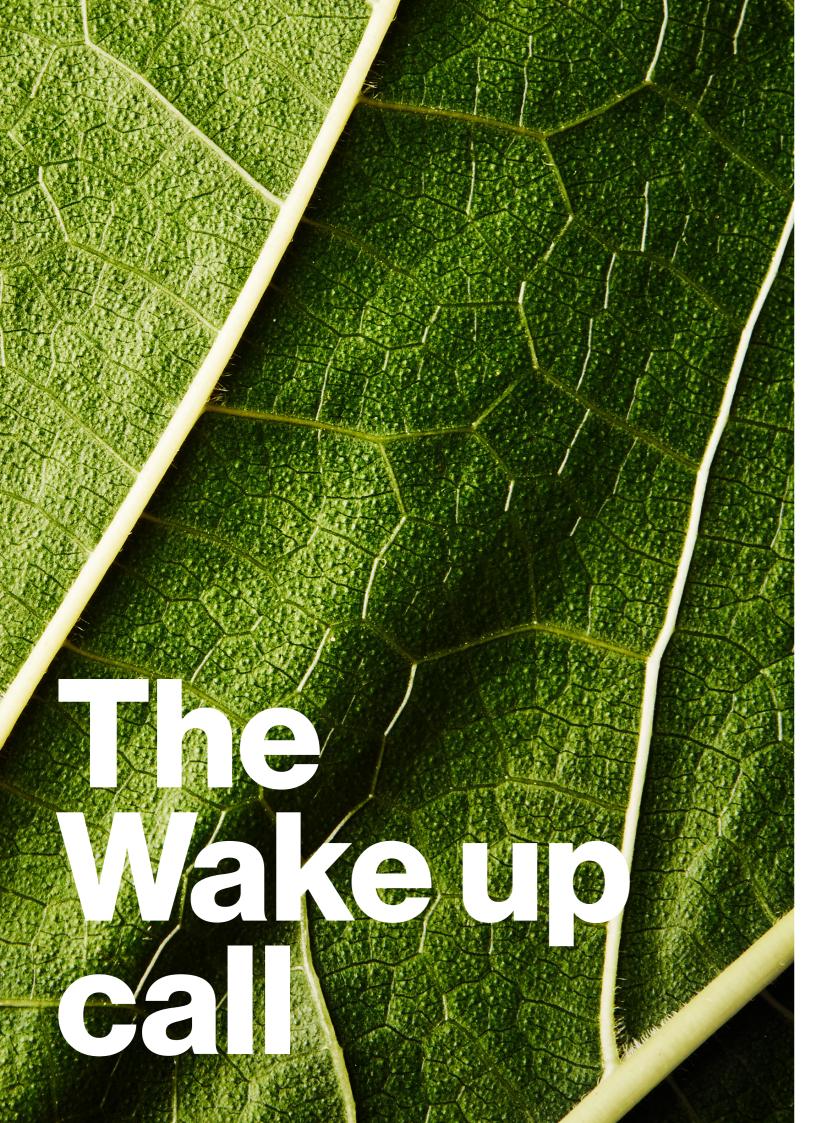

Net Zero is no longer background noise, it's the deciding factor in whether businesses win work, keep clients, or get left out.

Every tender, contract and partnership now comes with the same question: show your plan for carbon, energy, waste and social value. Without it, you risk being marked down or excluded altogether.

Business contributes across the board. Offices and shops use energy every day. Emails, cloud storage and websites drive up digital emissions. Company cars, travel and supply chains add more still. Even small service firms leave a footprint that clients are starting to measure.

Why care? Because buyers, investors and regulators already do.

No plan means fewer points.

No data means exclusion.

No action means falling behind.

For a consultancy, missing out might mean losing a £50k contract. For an agency, a client worth six figures. For a supplier, access to frameworks worth millions. Just two or three lost opportunities of that size can stall growth for an entire year. On the flip side, cutting waste, managing energy and cleaning up your digital footprint saves money directly on your bottom line.

The point is simple: get the basics right, measure your footprint, show your numbers, and you stay in the running. Running a business is already a full-time job — Net Zero doesn't need to feel like homework or cost the earth.

Does this really apply to me?

Most people think carbon emissions only come from big factories and heavy industry. In fact, small and solo businesses together create nearly half of UK business emissions. Even the

It shows up in everyday ways:

smallest company leaves a footprint.

- **Energy use:** Heating, cooling and lighting a workspace can add up to over 1 tonne of CO₂ a year from a single home office.
- **Travel:** Commuting, company cars and client visits all add to your footprint.
- Working from home: Remote work still needs heating, electricity and broadband, often the biggest share for small firms
- **Purchasing:** Every laptop, coffee or supply order carries hidden emissions.
- Digital activity: Emails, cloud storage, websites and video calls all consume energy.
- Waste: From packaging to old IT kit, disposal has a carbon cost.

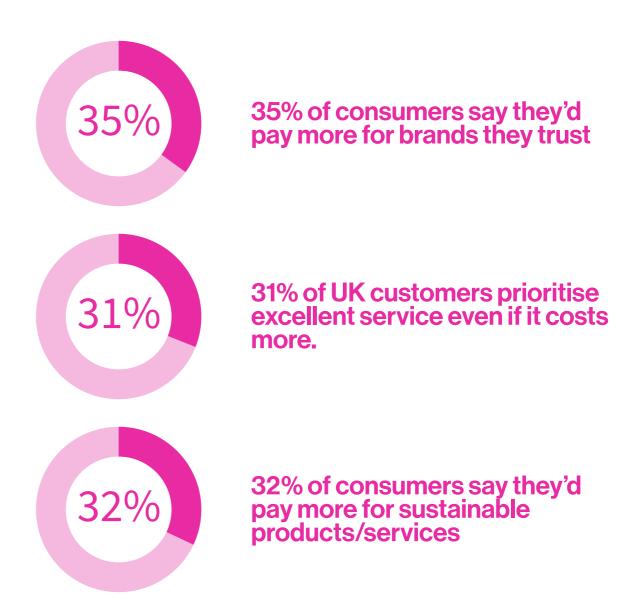
If you run a team of 50, or you're just one person in a spare room, this applies to you, because every business has a footprint. You're part of someone else's Scope 3 emissions, (t's everything outside a company's direct control, all the emissions created by their supply chain.). Your reputation is on the line, and clients, investors and regulators are starting to ask.



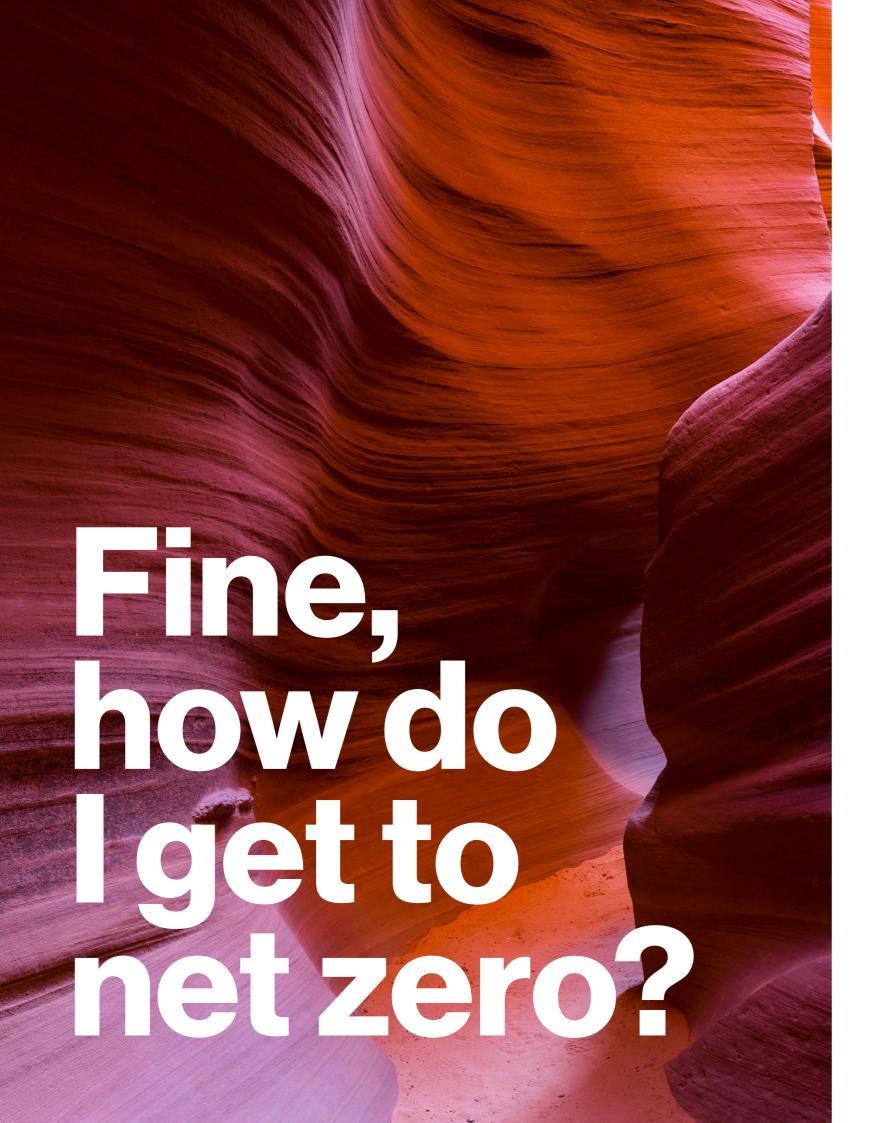
By 2030 we should limit emissions to a maximum of 2,500 kg CO2e per person per year

By 2050 We should reduce this further to about 700 kg CO2e per person per year

45% of people say they rely on businesses to make sustainable products the standard



Consumers don't just buy on price. 35% say they'll pay more for brands they trust (EY), while 31% are happy to pay a premium for excellent service (Institute of Customer Service). And 32% would pay more for sustainable products, with a PwC study finding an average +9.7% premium for goods that prove their credentials.





Measure it

Know your carbon footprint (fuel, energy, materials, transport, waste). Without the numbers, you can't prove progress.



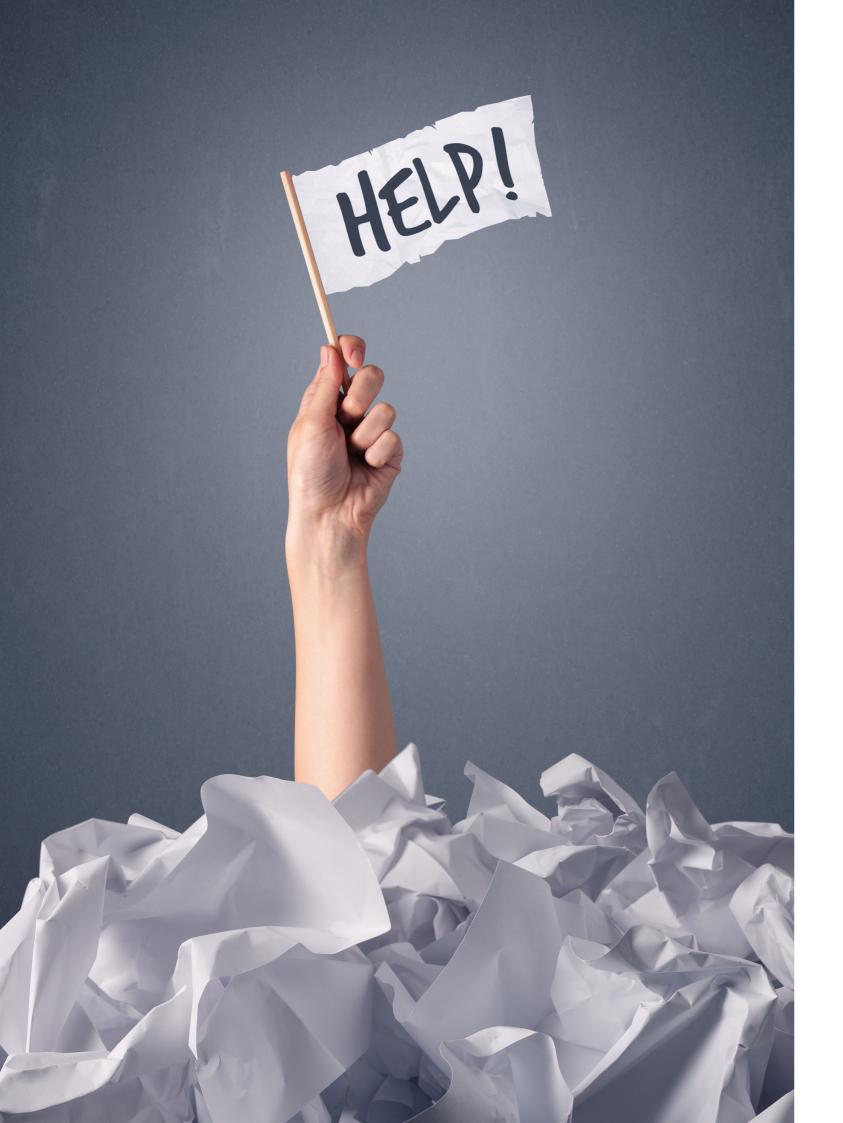
Cut it

Tackle the obvious: reduce fuel use, switch off plant and generators, consolidate deliveries, use recycled materials, cut waste



Prove it

Keep records and publish a simple Carbon Reduction Plan. That's what clients and frameworks expect to see in tenders.

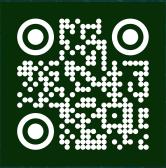
